



FACULTY MEETING MINUTES
October 3, 2018
Heritage Commons, Samuel Read Hall Building

The meeting was called to order at 3:37 p.m.

I. Approval of Minutes

The Minutes of the September 5, 2018 faculty meeting were approved as written.

II. Reports

A. President

The President's written report was distributed via e-mail from the President's Office on October 2, 2018. There were no questions for President Birx.

B. Provost

There were no questions for Provost Dorff.

C. Principal Policy Making Committees

Committee reports from Academic Affairs, Academic Technology and Online Education, Curriculum Committee, Faculty Welfare, General Education, and Graduate Council were provided with the Agenda as Appendices A-F.

Kate Elvey, Co-Chair of the General Education Committee, explained that the Sunset Renewal process is resuming this year. Given the timing of the notice of this, the deadline for submissions this year is February 1, 2019. In future years, the deadline will be in December. While not required this year, all faculty are encouraged to begin considering the Habits of Mind for inclusion in their syllabi. A faculty member expressed concern that syllabi for Gen Ed courses are already lengthy. If adding the Habits of Mind, perhaps other elements currently required could be removed. Detailed information was provided with the Agenda as Appendix E: General Education Committee Report. Faculty were asked to send their proposals and any questions to the Gen Ed Committee Chair e-mail address, psu-general-ed-chair@plymouth.edu.

D. Other reports:

1. The General Education Coordinator Report was provided with the Agenda as Appendix G. There were no questions for the General Education Coordinator about the report.

2. Ascent Program Report - Jason Moran, Clarissa Uttley, Rebecca Grant and other Ascent program faculty

Jason Moran gave an update about the Ascent program, which was first created for AY 17-18 as an initiative to reduce ‘summer melt’. For AY 18-19, 45 new, first-year students participated in this week-long, residential program, an increase from 29 last summer. Students benefit from two 1-credit courses, the Habits of Mind Experience (HOME) and one of four Toolkit Courses. Of the 45 students who attended the program, 43 are still enrolled.

Clarissa Uttley noted that she teaches graduate courses exclusively now and that it was very exciting to be among first year students again. This is a very fulfilling experience for students and faculty. Students completed a survey at the end of the program and their feedback was very positive. This is a meaningful, purposeful program. Jason Moran thanked the faculty members who participated in the planning and teaching of this year’s program.

3. A report from the Transition Leadership Team was provided via e-mail along with the Agenda. There were no questions for the Chair of the Transition Leadership Team.

- B. MOTION:** To amend the Faculty Bylaws, ARTICLE XI / Section D: Committee Descriptions, Section 2: Academic Technology and Online Education Committee (Submitted and presented by Lynn Johnson, Chair. The proposed language is attached as Appendix H.)

The motion was moved and seconded. Lynn Johnson spoke to the motion.

The proposed name change to Academic Technology Committee reflects that Online Education is a component of Academic Technology and is redundant to include in the title of the Committee.

The proposed changes to the Committee function clarify and better reflect the current responsibilities of the Committee and needs of the faculty and students at Plymouth State University. A faculty member questioned if this Committee has oversight of an online education policy. Lynn Johnson confirmed that there is such a policy and that the Committee found that it would be best to clarify the functions of the Committee before revising the online education policy.

A question was raised about one function of the Committee being to assist in setting priorities for the campus technology plan; has this function gone away? While one of the functions assigned to the Committee includes serving as an advisory board for academic technology decision making, this doesn't address setting priorities. How is this happening? Provost Dorff explained that we are trying to channel any requests through the clusters to the Office of Academic Affairs for consideration. For example, we are currently reviewing the many different software programs in use across campus to determine if we truly need all of these and if we are using them effectively. In response to a question about vendors trying to sell us their products, Provost Dorff noted that these requests are reviewed at the Cabinet level.

The motion passed by voice vote.

The meeting adjourned at 4:12 p.m.

APPENDIX A:

Academic Affairs Committee Report Chair, Sam Miller October 2018

The committee met for the first time this year on Monday October 17, 2018. During that meeting, a number of issues were discussed.

1. On-call Academic Integrity Panels: The committee discussed how best to compile a list of on-call volunteers for the Academic Integrity Panels, which may, or may not be needed, under the new policy. The committee contacted Program Coordinators and Cluster Leaders for potential names.
2. The committee discussed (briefly) the idea to revise the academic probation and warning policy that would trigger an academic warning when a student's GPA reaches 2.3, instead of 2.0. More work will be done on that later.
3. The committee discussed the idea of Academic Recovery Support Sessions for students who are on probation. This fall, Beth Wichland and MaryAnne Turner began offering Academic Support Recovery Sessions for those on Academic Probation. Session attendance is mentioned on their Strategies for Academic Success which they now sign and return. The sessions are conducted by those that work in that area. There are 8 sessions offered and at this time, they need to select at least 3 to attend. The sessions are: PASS & CAS, Stress Management & Test Anxiety, Study Strategies, Writing Center & Math Activities Center, Counseling Center & Student Support Foundation, Student Account Services/Financial Aid, Student Engagement and David Zehr (Student Advocate). Students had the opportunity to sign up online or during the two introductory sessions that were held prior to the beginning of the sessions. During the introductory sessions Beth and MaryAnne also stressed that they are always available to meet with them if they need additional support. More discussion will take place on this pilot program and any permanent policy will require a formal change to the academic catalog.
4. The Academic Affairs Committee received a request from a faculty member to begin a conversation on an academic integrity policy for faculty.

Discussion Items:

- **Process to select at-large student representatives:** Emails will be sent to all faculty requesting that information about opportunities for student participation on the ATOEC committee exist and explaining the process for self-nomination.
 - Process for self-nomination: Students should email the Chair of ATOEC, Lynn Johnson, with a note explaining their desire to serve on the committee. Students will meet with the Chair to go over responsibilities, attendance /commitment requirements (2 absences and student will be removed from the committee), and committee function. After the meeting students can decide whether or not they still want to serve. Appointments are in order of contact (first come, first served).
- **Review of Technology Innovation Proposal (TIP):** discussion about possible due date revision and needed proposal form edits. Discussion will continue at the October meeting.
- **Clusters’ role within ATOEC**
 - Discussion on cross cluster representation on ATOEC considering the new university structure; coordination around clusters and academic technology; some clusters have tech representation, some do not
 - Chair will reach out to get feedback from the different clusters; have conversations with them to ensure ATOEC is properly supporting cross cluster faculty

Upcoming Deadlines:

All proposals to convert existing programs to 4-credits are required to come to the Curriculum Committee by November 16 in order to make the 2019-2020 catalog. Our February meeting will be reserved for *new* program proposals or individual course proposals. As always, our March meeting will be reserved for minor individual course modifications and other smaller proposals.

- October 12 (4 pm) is the deadline for the October 19 meeting (if you are submitting updated materials from an earlier proposal, you may want to submit them by October 5 for inclusion in our October online voting session).
- November 9 (4 pm) is the deadline for the November 16 meeting (if you are submitting updated materials from an earlier proposal, you may want to submit them by November 2 for inclusion in our November online voting session).
- In December we will only have an online voting session for minor curricular changes. However, if you need to submit updated materials from an earlier proposal, you can submit them by December 7 for inclusion in our December online voting session.

This allows Admissions to prepare a recruiting strategy. For the purposes of recruiting, new programs should ideally be proposed to the Curriculum Committee in the late spring a full year and a half ahead of the target catalog.

APPENDIX D:

Faculty Welfare Committee Report Chair, Lisa Doner October 2018

On Sept 14, the Faculty Welfare Committee met and discussed focus areas for this academic year. There are several ongoing tasks from last year:

- *Intellectual Property Policy*
Over the summer, the Faculty Welfare Committee did not meet as a committee, but the Chair met with Academic Affairs to discuss the Intellectual Property Policy document revision process. At that meeting, Academic Affairs and Faculty Welfare agreed upon an iterative process of edits and revisions to the IP policy document. The process starts with Academic Affairs submitting a version to Faculty Welfare. Faculty Welfare then reviews it, edits the document and returns it to Academic Affairs. The IP Policy document-sharing and editing continues until both parties are satisfied that the IP policy meets the essential needs of both parties. The document then is presented to the Faculty to review and vote to adopt.
- *Promotion and Tenure Policy within Clusters*
Faculty Welfare will continue to monitor promotion and tenure policies as they develop within the different clusters. This process will be similar to that of last year, where we invited cluster representatives to visit and, in a forum, share the approaches and possible problems with the process as it plays out in the different clusters. We will especially focus on promotion review processes for those groups not covered by union contracts.

We also agreed to pursue a new task this year, to survey the whole faculty to identify areas of impairment or disfunction and/or gaps in PSU-faculty systems that create higher than acceptable levels of work environment stress or impede career advancement. Many of the changes enacted across campus have had consequences that may not be fully appreciated yet. The purpose of the survey is to identify hot-spots for concern and enable Faculty Welfare to develop policy or management recommendations.

The General Education committee met in September and focused on Sunset Renewals.

The Sunset Renewal process will resume this year. We updated the Sunset Renewal form (attached), which is now a separate form from the Gen Ed proposal form. In order to avoid a future overload of sunset renewals in a given year, we took the original sunset date and added three years. Those that were due in AY 2015-16 will be due this year. The Gen Ed Committee has put a plan in place to have Sunsets caught up over the next five years. The attached table has updated Sunset dates for Directions and Connections courses.

While not required this year, we encourage all faculty to begin considering, and discussing, the Habits of Mind in their syllabi. As the adopted Gen Ed Outcomes, the Habits of Mind will be central to Sunset Renewal and Gen Ed proposals in the future.

The deadline for submissions is **February 1, 2019**.

Motion from the Academic Technology and Online Education Committee: To make the following bylaw changes to Article XI; Section D; #2 Name and Functions

Rationale: The proposed name change reflects that “Online Education” is a component of Academic Technology and is redundant to include in the title of the committee. The proposed changes to the committee function clarify and better reflect the current responsibilities of the committee and needs of the faculty and students at Plymouth State University.

Note: **Bold text** indicates proposed language; ~~Strikethrough text~~ represents current language.

Article XI Committees

C. Committee Descriptions

2. ~~Academic Technology and Online Education Committee~~ **Academic Technology Committee**

a. Composition

Eight faculty members elected by the faculty for staggered three-year terms and three students (one of whom shall be a member of the Student Senate) shall be voting members of the committee. Additional voting members shall include the Director of Client Services and Academic Technologies, the Assistant Vice President & Chief Information Officer of Information Technologies, and an Academic Affairs Officer. The Director of the Applications & Development (A&D) Team will serve as a non-voting member. The Chair may request others to serve as non-voting members for full or half year renewable terms based on the needs of the committee. The committee elects its own chair who shall be a faculty member.

In addition, the Faculty Speaker shall appoint an additional faculty member to be a non-voting participant on the committee for a one-year, non-renewable term. This member shall be selected from a pool of faculty with no more than five years of service at PSU. The Chair of the Academic Technology and Online Education Committee serves on the University Steering Committee. Approved May 2017

- ~~Works collaboratively with stakeholders to assess technology used in the academic environment and pedagogy related to online instruction.~~
- ~~Uses assessment information to inform future academic technology investments.~~
- ~~Recommends policies for faculty approval related to online education and technology-driven changes to pedagogy.~~
- ~~Advocates for adequate professional development resources for faculty related to use and assessment of technology for teaching and learning, both on campus and through external development opportunities.~~

Functions:

- **Develop and review policies, based on sound pedagogical principles, that support the integration of educational/academic technology in order to enhance the Plymouth State University student learning and overall academic experience;**
- **Provide support for technology innovations through the Technology Innovation Proposal (TIP) and Technology Enhanced Space Proposal processes that enhance Cluster or cross-Cluster student academic experiences;**
- **Vet proposals and provide recommendations for enhanced academic technology environments/spaces (Technology Enhanced Space proposal process);**
- **Gather data from faculty, through surveys, focus groups, etc., to determine:**
 - a. **Ways in which academic technology is used by faculty to enhance student learning;**
 - b. **Faculty goals for increased use of academic technology**
 - c. **Provide input to support ongoing academic/education technology professional development for faculty**
- **Share academic technology faculty data with appropriate Plymouth State University decision making entities to assist with an informed academic technology decision making process;**
- **Serve as advisory board for academic technology decision making, including, but not limited to student learning and student support platforms; software selection and retiring; and long-range technology planning as it relates to Academic Technology and instructional technology in support of pedagogy;**
- **Communicate regularly with key stakeholders to assist with activities that support academic technology adoption and integration;**
- **Advocate for appropriate financial support for academic technology that enhances the student learning experience at Plymouth State University.**
